1 Engaging Educators and Approaches to Incorporating Global Education in the Learning Process

2 Promoting Participation

Board Game by Youth Organization "Creative Minds for Culture"

Participants will have the opportunity to try a board game created by young people, aimed at simulating real-life situations and highlighting our individual participation. This game introduces players to the concept of participation and how it manifests in daily life. The game is educational, entertaining, and helps to understand the everyday expressions of participation.

Participation Game "Get Involved!" by Youth Organization "Nītaureņi"

The game is designed to strengthen participation skills and knowledge about its forms and opportunities for involvement at local, national, and international levels. It encourages players to find answers to various participation-related questions and challenge themselves by experiencing participation in real life.

Powerful Stories of Change

In this workshop, we will explore how to inspire meaningful action and positive change through storytelling. While we engage in various activities, how effectively are we communicating stories that resonate and motivate others? 4 Glocal Idea Cauldron

Together with LAPAS experts, participants will experiment with creative idea development methods, taking a step closer to developing global education project proposals.

5 How Our Lifestyle Affects Climate Change and Practical Introduction to the Educational Game Method "Climate Call"

Organized by: Green Liberty Workshop language: Latvian

Does flying to Thailand have a greater impact on climate change than eating meat every day for a year? Does attending a festival have a bigger effect than a flight to Vietnam? In the session "Climate Call" we will explore answers to these and similar questions. Participants will have the opportunity to learn more about climate change challenges and actively engage by trying out the card game "Climate Calls", which helps players understand the impact of everyday actions on climate change. The session aims to inspire and spark discussions about the impact of daily actions on climate change, as well as introduce a teaching method that helps understand the relationship between lifestyle, climate change, and sustainable development. All participants will receive several game sets to use in their work with students.
